Full and Associate Members—please note - that a valid Group Membership card must be produced upon request. Failure to do so or if the card is invalid, that particular activity shall not take place.

IAM Documents Declaration Forms—<u>must</u> be completed by the Associate at the first run. Attendance at 'Associate Evenings' by Associate Members—is required.

Do remember - When you have taken a 'pre-test' drive - and have been recommended to apply for your actual IAM Test. This recommendation will come from you having demonstrated the standard that we expect of you to pass - however - it will still depend on your driving on the actual day of your IAM test with an IAM Examiner. Your actual Test application will done via the IAM DTE database and the group's database user. Within 2-3 weeks - an Examiner will contact you to arrange a date, time and location for your actual test.

After taking your test - please let your Observer <u>and</u> Chief Observer know of the result as soon as possible. This allows us to say 'well done' — and to free your Observer for any waiting Associate.

Observers— tell your Chief Observer when your Associate passes—as we would much rather be told twice than not at all!

FROM YOUR CHIEF OBSERVER

Following all of the recent changes within the IAM in Chiswick, the **new Standards** are beginning to filter down to group level.

As Chief Observer within the Wolverhampton Group I will be ensuring that all **our "Group" Observers** are qualified to **the independently recognised IMI Local Observer (LO) standard**, within a time scale of December, 2017. I am pleased to say that all of our group Observers, have already either achieved L.O. status, or are currently undergoing training to do so, and to meet the target date, by which all Observers need to be qualified to these new standards.

Our National Observers are also independently assessed and qualified under the IMI standards

Our Group Newsletter—has adopted the new epithet and been renamed "The Thinking Driver" which is exactly what the IAM is all about and where the focus of our new standards lie. The basics are the same but one major change has taken place which should be welcomed by everyone and that is that the "Standards" passed on by the Observer to the new Associate are the same as the "Standards" that will be examined when that Associate goes for Test.

The "Standards" passed on by the Observer to the new Associate are the same as the "Standards" that will be examined when that Associate goes for Test.

The expectations of the Associate, the Observer and the Examiner are now not just similar, but the same. It may come as a surprise to some to hear that prior to the current changes, because there was no overview of the "whole system" this was not the case and it was possible for an Observer to advise an Associate in one direction to find that the Examiner expected another!

The other key change that has taken place is that **the System as a whole is now documented in full and tested to be consistent** across all of its forms; though there may be personal opinions the facts and directions are now consistent.

Should you wish to you can go onto our web site (www.wolvesiam.org) and read through the **Observers Handbook** and, if you so wish, the **Examiners Handbook** too. There are no more "hidden policies or considerations" regarding the expectations of the Advanced Driver.

With the advancement in vehicle technology there are **some changes to "older" standards** to allow, for example, the overlap of gear and brakes on manual vehicles, the use of "Drive" only throughout a test on automatic vehicles, the use of driving aids, (speed limiters, park assist and so on) and the use of forms of steering other than the preferred pull-push.

We would suggest that for those of you interested, our Observers would be only too happy to go for a drive (or two), with you to go through these changes and in effect "bring you up to date"; (For this contact me as chief.observer@wolvesiam.org).

A successful pre-test

run—still means that you continue your observed runs right up to the actual test. Do not go off the boil! Your IAM test result will be on how you drove on that test run.

When you pass your test—let us know via your observer so that all the group can celebrate your success.



Skills Day with the Women's Institute

Skills Day with the WI at British Motor Museum at Gaydon 24th September 2016

This day was the second of five days scheduled to take place with the **Women's Institute**; the first in April was massively over-subscribed as was this day, a very encouraging response.

Organization for the day was excellent, but then we would expect nothing less from the BMM with appropriate input from the IAM.

The sixty or so ladies were divided into four Groups; at any time two Groups were in classroom sessions with the other two Groups doing either a "Taster Session" drive or Slow Manoeuvring. A full car park had been allocated for the close manoeuvring which gave excellent space for six people to be in cars at the same time without any risk of close vehicle proximity; the ladies were all put through a session improving their parallel and perpendicular parking skills as well as reversing skills and all in cars which they were unfamiliar with as Suzuki UK had been kind enough to loan vehicles for use through the day. The drives had been set by the local IAM Group in Stratford and were scheduled to be around twenty-five to thirty minutes in duration incorporating town, restricted country road and also national speed limit country roads. Challenging as there were many hazards throughout the routes including managing some steep down hills with gradients of 1:16 and very sharp bends half way down, (Edge Hill for those who may know the area).

The practical activities were not designed to just expose any lack of skills but to be fun and demonstrate how much easier a more knowledgeable approach to driving could make any journey easier and less stressful for both driver and passenger alike.

All of the four drives that I did were very different though all demonstrated some "bad practices" throughout the journey. The encouraging thing was that in all cases keenness to learn was paramount and pointing out an "issue" always resulted in a desire to correct that issue, be it steering or gear selection or some other matter. There was never a question of "well this has always worked for me", more, "that does make it easier and better" followed by a very real "thank you" for the professional advice being given.

At the summing up at the end of the day the clear feedback was that everyone had learnt something through the day; around twenty of the sixty signed up for Advanced Driving on the day and a number of others said they wanted to talk with husbands or others before they took things forward; a great response making the day worthwhile for everyone.

At Wolverhampton we are very keen to be a part of the greater IAM activities ensuring that we are one of the Groups at the forefront of IAM activities and not just a follower.

The Annual IAM National Conference 2016

The Annual IAM National Conference—was held on 22nd and 23rd October at Aston University in Birmingham.

An invitation is extended to all local Groups throughout the UK to attend either on the Saturday for Drivers Groups and on the Sunday for Rider Groups.

In essence there is little difference between the two days however it allows an easy division of the numbers as the majority of Groups send two members to represent and gain insight into the forthcoming strategies of the Institute. This year both Roy Richards, Chief Observer and Jonathan Hughes attended for the Wolverhampton Advanced Motorists Group.

The day was divided into various sessions;

- · Business Update;
- Young Drivers Retention;
- · Group Handbook Update;
- Insurance; and lastly—
- Statistics and IAM Manifesto.

The presentations will be posted on our web-site for all to view within the next few days.

Of all of the discussion groups, perhaps the most important, and surprising, was that about insurance.

- Two representatives of IAM Surety were present and had the statistics to hand to substantiate the detail given but it was clear that any IAM Member who had held their Advanced Driving qualification, (and had not been re-tested in some way for greater than five years), was actually MORE likely to be involved in an incident than an untrained driver.
- Investigations are being undertaken as to why this might be the case however it makes it clear to us all that if we have held our Membership for a number of years and had not done any further training, that perhaps now was the time to use the facilities of the Group to do that training. No necessity to undertake a full course, unless wanted, but simply perhaps to do a few Observed Drives to polish up on skills that may have become rusty.
- The outcome of the detail presented is that people who have recent skills proven through additional qualifications or skills updates are going to have better, that is lower, insurance quotations than those who have not and with IAM Surety now covering well over 50% of all IAM Members this is important to us all. In this if you want to talk with someone then please contact Roy Richards our Chief Observer.

IAM-INFORMATION

THE ADVANCED DRIVING TEST

What the Examiner expects

The Test takes about 90 minutes, over all types of roads and using your own car. The four essential qualities are **Concentration**, **Observation**, **Anticipation** and **Planning**. The Examiner is the holder of a Police Advanced Driving Certificate. A full understanding of what is expected can be found in the IAM publication "Advanced Driving". A number of important points are mentioned here:

THE PRINCIPLES OF ADVANCED DRIVING

- Do you concentrate properly and avoid distractions?
- Can you read the road and anticipate potential hazards in good time?
- Are hazards dealt with in a planned and systematic way?
- Do you use your mirrors before changing your speed or position and do you always give a signal to other road users if they will benefit or appreciate one?
- Can you drive with reasonable restraint, but not indecision?
- Is your judgement of speed and distance accurate?
- Do you drive with courtesy and consideration for other road users, including pedestrians?
- Are you always in the right place on the road, travelling at the right speed with the right gear engaged and able to stop safely in the distance you can see to be clear?

HANDLING SKILLS

- Are steering actions safe, smooth and accurate, and do you pass the wheel through your hands?
- Are gears smoothly and correctly selected?
- Do you make full use of automatic transmission, if your car is fitted with it?
- · Is your braking smooth and progressive?
- Do you use "acceleration sense"?

ADVANCED DRIVING SKILLS ON THE ROAD

- Do you keep up a reasonable pace and maintain good progress if conditions permit?
- Do you anticipate and react correctly to the situations developing ahead?
- Are the correct road position chosen and signals given in good time for the next manoeuvre?
- Are all signals, signs and road markings observed, obeyed and approached correctly?
- Are overtaking manoeuvres carried out smoothly, decisively and safely?
- Do you drive with proper restraint and proper sensitivity of control when the roads are slippery or visibility is reduced?
- Are manoeuvres such as parking, reversing, carried out smoothly and competently with effective all-round observations?

Advanced Drivers are expected to control the risks, despite the incorrect actions of others. Every journey can have its unexpected moments.

However, even successful candidates have made minor mistakes, which did not prevent them from passing the Advanced Driving Test.


