What is Masters?



- Open to all current IAM members
- IAM RoadSmart Masters programme provides true one to one mentoring, support and guidance
- Enabling you to attain the highest standard of civilian driving or riding ability in the country

The IAM RoadSmart Masters Test



- A 90 minute on-road test with two levels of pass
- Unfamiliar roads of all types
- The candidate will be expected to travel to the assessor
- Includes slow manoeuvring and theory knowledge checks. A good knowledge of Roadcraft and the Highway Code will be required!

The IAM RoadSmart Masters Test



- Test report form is now similar to the ADC & ARC however, 27 categories are marked
- Successful candidates will receive:

Test certificate

Personalised test report

Added to Masters register on the IAM RoadSmart website

Masters qualification lasts five years

What is expected of a Masters Driver or Rider



- A safe, legal, systematic drive or ride in accordance with Roadcraft
- Smooth, systematic, polished and flowing think quiet efficiency
- Applying cornering principles
- Assessing, planning and executing safe overtaking manoeuvres
- Recognising opportunities to make safe progress (within the speed limits)

What is expected of a Masters Driver or Rider



- Observations, anticipation, planning and awareness consistent with vehicle speed
- Applying sound judgement of speed and distance
- Delivering a fluent, relevant and continuous commentary (Cars)
- Knowledge of machine dynamics (Bikes Full Control)

Passing the Masters Test



- Any area marked as a '3 requires development' will result in the candidate being unsuccessful
- To pass the test and become a Master driver or rider a score of 39 or less must be recorded (starts at 27)
- To obtain a distinction a score of 34 or less must be recorded and a score of 1 must be recorded in the areas of safety, legality and slow manoeuvring
- To be a Master driver or rider you need to be commended in a minimum of 15 areas in a car or 14 on a motorcycle
- To pass with distinction this rises to 18 and 19 respectively

Development required.....



- Observations
- Anticipation
- Planning
- Progress
- Cornering
- Overtaking
- If it was not being tested I would not normally have done that! Never change what you normally do......

Planning – the 4 C's




- In the Correct position
- At the Correct speed
- With the Correct gear engaged

Positioning is critical






Cornering and positioning




- Best position?



Roundabouts




- Best position ?

- Mini roundabouts?




Overtaking – its all about planning





Single stage or Momentum




3 stage

Masters programme



- A personal logbook
- The latest copy of Roadcraft (or Motorcycle Roadcraft)
- An introductory drive or ride
- A dedicated Mentor
- Typically up to six sessions or 10-12 hours of mentoring (a top-up is available to purchase for those who require more mentoring to become a Master)
